How this funding has made an impact

Since the start of the funding in September 2013, we have been lucky to be able to spend the money received on a number of activities to help improve the provision of PE across the Primary phase.

The sports coaches have been very well received by pupils and staff.

- KS2 children have attended lots of competitions and events
- Year 5 and 6 G&T children have been identified and given the opportunity to attend GT academy.
- KS1 have attended cross country competition and will be hosted one this year. We have also attended football, tennis and multi skills festivals with children from other schools in the partnership.

Clubs held since the funding

Infants – multi skills, PE, Survival, dance, football, tennis,

Juniors – Huddersfield Town Football, dance, gymnastics, archery, change 4 life, orienteering, tri-golf

73% of KS1 children attended a club in academic year 2013-2014. So far this year (2014-2015) 50% of KS1 children have already attended a club.

In KS2, 48% of children have attended an after school club or attended an event.

New equipment

- Juniors have had some new super gymnastics equipment, five-a-side football goals, tri-golf equipment.

Specialist PE teaching

-Jayne Lawrence has spent time this year with Year 5/6 helping to prepare them for the expectations of High school and supporting teachers to identify G&T and increase their subject knowledge.

Parents' questionnaire results:

98% of KS1 parents felt that their children enjoyed PE and 100% said that they had seen their skills increase.

100% of KS1 parents said that they were satisfied with the range of sports clubs provided.

Some parent comments about what improvements they have noticed:

"I have noticed my son's balance and reflex skills have improved" Parent of Jacob Fryer Yr 2 pupil

"Coordination, balancing and his running and jumping skills" – Parent of Hayden Bandy Yr 2 pupil

Pupil questionnaire results:

95% of children said they enjoyed PE and 97% said their lessons were interesting. 100% thought that their skills were getting better. 98% thought that PE teaches you how to work as part of a team and is an important part of a healthy lifestyle.

Funding has also given us the opportunity to spend time and resources on linking our PE to other curriculum areas,

For example we now use ICT in the form of i-pads to evaluate and record our work. We have also worked with our specialist dance coach to develop dance planning that is linked the children's afternoon topic work.
