In our phonics groups, we will continue to look at different letters and sounds.

Numeracy

We will continue to investigate the times tables in readiness for the Year 4 test in mid-June. We will be completing work on fractions and solving number problems based on these.

Science

Children will be learning about habitats. They will explore the urban and rural differences in the UK. They will discover more about the biodiversity in a variety of habitats and be able to report on the impact of deforestation.

Habitat	An area where animals and plants live.
Rural habitat	Area of countryside with few buildings.
Urban habitat	Area with many buildings where people live and work.
Biodiversity	The variety of living things in a habitat.
Deforestation	Clearing trees from a woodland or forest habitat so the land can be used by humans.
Rewilding	A method of increasing biodiversity by reducing human acitivty.
Nature reserve	An area where living things are protected from human acitivty.
