For this event, we will be using the School Cloud booking system (<https://nlc.parentseveningsystem.co.uk>), with appointments via video which runs in a normal web browser (i.e. internet explorer, edge, safari, google chrome etc)

All appointments are limited to 5 minutes and there will be a countdown timer at the top of your video screen to let you know how long is left. When the appointment ends, you will automatically be taken to a waiting lobby before your next appointment starts.

Please note appointments are limited and it may not be possible to make an appointment in the time you are available or with all of your child's teachers.

The following subjects will not be included in the event due to completion of course :

- PE

Due to staff absence there will be no appointments for Modern Foreign Languages.

Students are not required to attend the meetings but it may be beneficial for them to hear the key points on progress, attainment and achievement.
