

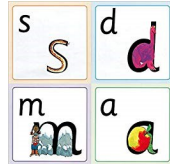
## Reception

### Personal, Social and Emotional Development

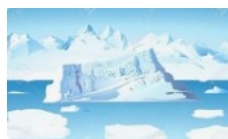
The themes of loneliness, friendship, identity and belonging are key this half term.

We will be doing lots of drama and role-play to understand the themes of our two new story books. Some opportunities for writing:

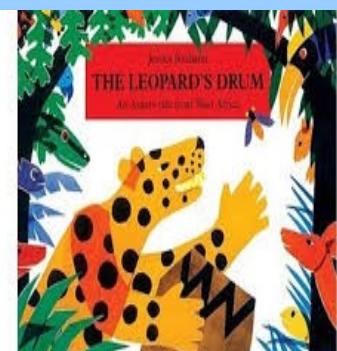
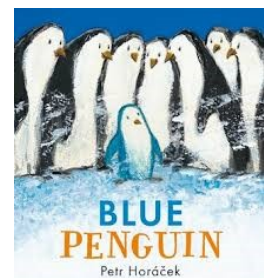
*Creating a passport*
